Arafura Athletics Stadium Code of Conduct

All users are requested to abide by the following when attending the Arafura Athletics Stadium. The Stadium area includes the competition arena, forecourt, breezeway, change rooms, toilets, gardens and carparks. The Stadium caters for a variety of sports, whereby the practice of athletics takes precedence over any other sport(s).

The following relates directly to the minimum standard and etiquette that should be conducted from all Stadium Hirers and Users:

- Provide for the general welfare, health and safety of all person(s) using the Stadium.
- An appropriate manner of dress, footwear and behaviour to be maintained at all times.
- Respect the cultures, beliefs, opinions and decisions of others.
- Treat all person(s) including volunteers, athletes and general public with courtesy, sensitivity, tact, consideration and humility.
- Refrain from the use of profane, insulting, harassing or otherwise offensive language.
- Respect the Stadium, the Staff of the Stadium, other users and all equipment.
- Leave the Stadium in the same condition you found it.
- All children under the age of 12 must be in the direct supervision of a adult.
- Track Awareness, look both ways before crossing the track.
- Keep clear of the Throwing Cage and Javelin arena adjacent the hockey end of the stadium.
- Conduct your activities in an appropriate location within the Stadium.
- Set up your activities taking into account the impact on other users. Avoid any congestion on and adjacent the running track.

- Allow adequate space for warm up on the infield, approximately 10 metres clear of running rail.
- All ball sport activities are to be confined to the infield only.
- Report any damage or other maintenance issues to the person supervising your activity, or a Stadium Staff member.
- Report any emergencies to the appropriate authorities after first taking immediate action to ensure the health and safety of all the participants.
- Abstain from the use or consumption of all alcohol, cigarettes and illegal substances when whilst in the Stadium, unless written approval by Stadium Board of Management.
- Please use the rubbish bins provided at the Stadium, for all rubbish. Help maintain a clean environment and Stadium by picking up all rubbish and using the bins provided.
- Athletic shoe spikes to be worn on the track only. Football boots to be worn on the infield only, do not walk on the track.
- Do not train in Lane 1 and Lane 2.
- If any equipment has been used please return the equipment to its original place upon completion.
- Be aware of all signage and notices within the Stadium.
- Abide by all responsible requests from the Manager and/or Stadium Staff members.

Failure to abide by the above Code of Conduct may result in the following actions:

1. Cancellation of a Booking;
2. Expulsion from the Stadium; and/or
3. Contacting the Police.

Competition Code of Conduct

For Players

- *Be a good sport. Play for enjoyment. Play by the rules.*
- Work hard for your team as well as yourself.
- Treat all team-mates and opponents as you enjoy being treated yourself.
- Co-operate with team and game officials.
- Control your behavior on and off the field.
- Learn to value honest effort, skilled performance and improvement.

For Teachers and Coaches

- Set a good example for your players.
- Encourage and create opportunities to develop individual skills. Teach a wide range of team skills.
- Teach your players to be friendly towards officials and opponents.
- Remove from the field of play any of your players whose behavior is not acceptable.

For Spectators

- Demonstrate appropriate social behavior.
- Remember children play for enjoyment. Don't let your behavior detract from their enjoyment.
- Let game officials conduct events without interference.
- Support skilled performances and team play with generous applause.
- Demonstrate respect for opposing players and their supporters.

For Parents

- Encourage participation by your children.
- Provide a model of good sports behavior for your child to copy.
- Be courteous in your communication with players, team officials, game officials and sport administrators.
- Encourage honest effort, skilled performance and team loyalty.
- Do not interfere with the conduct of any events.

General

- Take care of all sporting and track equipment as if it was your own.
- Maintain a clean and rubbish free environment.
- If you have any issues or problems, notify your Team Manager only, if they are unable to sort the issue then they alone will raise the issue at the next level.
 - All team enquiries MUST be taken directly to their Team Management.
 - Team Management if unsure then take queries to the Technical Info Centre
 - No-one is to enter the Control Room

Failure to adhere to these guidelines will incur penalties and with continued misdemeanours that following procedures will be taken:

Strike 1 A warning by an official (team or event)

Strike 2 A second warning by the Meeting or Competitor Directors

Strike 3 Possible removal from the venue with your child (if applicable)



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
